Time 'Scales'

- 🔥 Spring 2014: Dragons created by specialist sculptor
- 🔥 Spring 2014: Artists invited to submit designs for the Dragons
- 🔥 April-May 2014: Commissioned artists create their designs on the Dragons.
- 🔥 July-September 2014: Trail opens to the public after Dragons are sited at high profile locations throughout the area.
- 🔥 Autumn 2014: Dragons will be exhibited and auctioned off to raise money for Community Projects in Taunton Deane through the Somerset Community Foundation.
